

# Holding Treasure Close

*[Jesus] went down to Nazareth with them and was obedient to them. But his mother treasured all these things in her heart.*


LUKE 2:51, NIV



Don't you love it when everything lines up just as you had hoped in a given day, without deviating from the plan? There is a semblance of safety that drops down like an oxygen mask in an airplane when you can see what's in front of you and plan for what's ahead. But when things don't go according to plan, you have to retrace your steps—and your hopes.

Have you thought about how Mary, the mother of Jesus, felt when she could not find her twelve-year-old son? Talk about the need for an oxygen mask! She and Joseph were on their way from Jerusalem back to Nazareth with a group of travelers when they realized he was missing. Retracing their steps, they frantically searched for him until they found him three days later in the Temple courts. The son that Mary wanted within arm's reach was in a place they likely didn't expect, interacting with those who were shaping the religious beliefs and practices of the day. And he was only twelve.

No doubt a celebration took place after Mary and Joseph found Jesus, which must have felt like a complete relief to Mary, who had carried him in her heart since conception. But she questioned Jesus, asking him how he could have treated them like that. Jesus said, "Why did you need to search? . . . Didn't you know that I must be in my Father's house?" (Luke 2:49).



Later we see that Mary, the mother of this young man who had a strength about him and a desire to love his Father, held these things in her heart. She recognized the treasure her son was and wanted to hold on to this treasure tightly. But she also recognized the one whom she was raising was a delight to God.

Sometimes as mothers we get caught up in the chase and don't think about the lives we are helping to mold. We often feel we can't hold our child close enough or long enough. Maybe, like Mary, you have thought about how you can hold on to the treasure of time and not release your child to the world just yet. You want to know that the one you are raising is close by.

Do you recognize the gift of loving your son or daughter, who needs the love only you can provide? We need to express our love even on the days that don't go as planned. Like Mary, we don't get to hold on to our treasure forever, but the treasure is still in our hearts. And so is the one you love.
